

Virtual Youth Profile Bank Explainer

How does virtual youth profile bank work?

SBWIB is creating a profile bank with video profiles and resumes for our participating youth involved with our programs or connected to our partners (including local school districts). SBWIB will grant employer partners access to the directory of participant profiles to better showcase participant talents while facilitating an outlet for youth to practice professional digital communication. Employer partners include employers looking to hire part time, full time and internship/ work experience positions.

How do youth upload their profile information?

Participants in the virtual youth profile bank can email thirty second video and resume using the supplied link to our landing page (https://www.southbay1stop.org/virtual-blueprint). Youth can record videos on their phone (no more than 30 seconds) and email themselves the content to upload to the landing page using WeTransfer. Attach your video then enter sbwibspecialprojects@gmail.com into the "Email to" line as well as your best email contact information. Youth must also complete a minor or adult media release form for their video entry to be eligible for the \$200 prize associated with our upcoming Virtual Blueprint Career Fair (June 17th). Who is eligible?

This option is currently available for youth participants that are age 16 years or older pending completion of an applicable media release form.

How long are submissions posted?

Submissions will be available via the SBWIB resume portal and the candidate profile bank for up to one year from the date of submission.

How can we view available employment options?

SBWIB will periodically facilitate virtual info sessions (beginning with our Virtual Blueprint Career Fair June 17th) with employers for all youth with entries into the candidate profile bank. Youth will have an opportunity to ask questions and interact with employers through virtual events. Additionally, all employer sessions will be recorded and made available to youth.
